BLUE 2016 is beyond thrilled to have, British Columbia's own, Mr. Rick Hansen as the keynote speaker for BLUE 2016.

To many, his name needs no explanation, for those not yet acquainted with this Canadian Hero who has raised more than 200 million dollars for spinal cord related injury programs, his inscription for the Order of Canada reads:

Already a world-renowned wheelchair athlete, this British-Columbian fulfilled a dream of wheeling around the world to make others aware of the potential of the disabled and to raise funds for spinal cord research among other things. His 44,000 km. journey, recently completed, took him to four continents and 33 countries, inspiring people around the world to realize their potential and raising many millions of dollars for the cause.

He is a member of the Canada's Sports Hall of Fame, a final torchbearer at the 2010 Winter Olympics, and even had a song written in his honor reach #1 on the Billboard Hot 100.

His message of hope and determination will change not only your officiating career but perhaps your life.

These I/E and Level IV clinics will run over two days – the Thursday, March 24 and Sunday March 27.

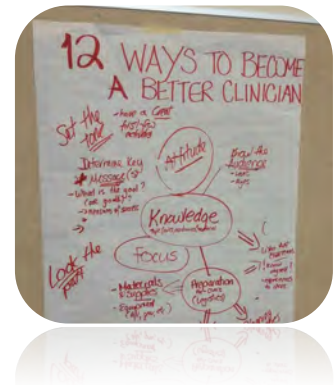
The Instructor / Evaluator Clinic gives the most up to date methods and information for instructing and evaluating the Softball Canada way.
