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SOFTBALL BC PRIVACY POLICY

Purpose of this Policy

Privacy of personal information is governed by the Personal Information Protection Act (“PIPA”). This policy describes the way that SOFTBALL BC collects, uses, retains, safeguards, discloses and disposes of personal information, and states SOFTBALL BC’s commitment to collecting, using and disclosing personal information responsibly. This policy is based on the standards required by PIPA, and SOFTBALL BC’s interpretation of these responsibilities.

Personal Information

Personal information is information about an identifiable individual. Personal information includes information that relates to their personal characteristics (e.g., gender, age, income, home address or phone number, ethnic background, family status), their health (e.g., health history, health conditions, health services received by them) or their activities and views (e.g., religion, politics, opinions expressed by an individual, an opinion or evaluation of an individual). Personal information, however, does not include contact information and work product.

Accountability

The Executive Director is the Privacy Officer and is responsible for monitoring information collection and data security.

If you are not satisfied with the responses you receive from SOFTBALL BC, the Provincial Privacy Officer also handles personal information access requests and complaints. The Privacy Officer may be contacted at the following address: #201, 8889- Walnut Grove Drive, Langley BC, V1M 2N7.

Purpose

Personal information will only be collected by SOFTBALL BC to meet and maintain the highest standard of organizing and programming the sport of Softball. SOFTBALL BC collects personal information from prospective members, members, coaches, umpires, participants, support staff and volunteers for purposes that include, but are not limited to, the following:

- a) Name, address, phone number, cell phone number, fax number and e-mail address for the purpose of communicating about SOFTBALL BC’s programs, events and activities.
- b) NCCP number, education, resumes and experience for database entry at the Coaching Association of Canada to determine level of certification and coaching qualifications.
- c) Credit card information for registration at conferences, travel administration, and purchasing equipment, coaching manuals and other products and resources.
- d) Date of birth, athlete biography, and member club to determine eligibility, age group and appropriate level of play.
- e) Banking information, social insurance number, criminal records check, resume, and beneficiaries for SOFTBALL BC’s payroll, company insurance and health plan.
- f) Criminal records check and related personal reference information for the purpose of implementing SOFTBALL BC’s volunteer screening program.

- g) Personal health information including provincial health card numbers, allergies, emergency contact and past medical history for use in the case of medical emergency and, in the case of staff, to access insurance programs..
- h) Athlete information including height, weight, uniform size, shoe size, feedback from coaches and trainers, performance results for athlete registration forms, outfitting uniforms, media relations, and various components of athlete and team selection.
- i) Athlete whereabouts information including sport/discipline, training times and venues, training camp dates and locations, travel plans, competition schedule, for Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport inquiries for the purposes of out-of-competition drug testing.
- j) Body weight, mass and body fat index to monitor physical response to training and to maintain an appropriate weight for competition.
- k) Marketing information including attitudinal and demographic data on individual members to determine membership demographic structure, and program wants and needs.
- l) Passport numbers and frequent flyer numbers for the purposes of arranging travel.
- m) Name, address, phone number, cell phone number, fax number and e-mail address for the purpose of providing insurance coverage, managing insurance claims and conducting insurance investigations.

If a purpose has not been identified herein, SOFTBALL BC will seek consent from individuals when personal information is used for a purpose not already consented to. This consent will be documented as to when and how it was received.

Consent

In addition to the implied consent provisions under PIPA, consent is required to be obtained by lawful means from individuals at the time of collection, prior to the use or disclosure of the personal information. If the consent to the collection, use or disclosure was not obtained upon receipt of the information, consent will be obtained prior to the use or disclosure of that information. SOFTBALL BC may collect personal information without consent where reasonable to do so and where permitted by law.

By providing personal information to SOFTBALL BC, individuals are consenting to the use of the information for the purposes identified in this policy.

SOFTBALL BC will not, as a condition of a product or service, require an individual to consent to the collection, use or disclosure of information beyond that required to fulfill the specified purpose. If consent is withheld on any matter set up herein SOFTBALL BC may refuse to provide a product or service and may restrict the individual from participating in SOFTBALL BC activities.

An individual may withdraw consent to the collection, use or disclosure of personal information at any time, subject to legal or contractual restrictions, provided the individual gives one week's notice of such withdrawal to SOFTBALL BC. The Privacy Officer will advise the individual of the implications of such withdrawal.

Limiting Collection

All personal information will be collected fairly, by lawful means and for the purposes as specified in this policy.

Limiting Use, Disclosure and Retention

Personal information will not be used or disclosed by SOFTBALL BC for purposes other than those for which it was collected as described herein, except with the consent of the individual or as required by law or set out in the PIPA.

Personal information will be retained for certain periods of time in accordance with the following:

- a) Registration data and athlete information will be retained indefinitely after an individual has left a program of SOFTBALL BC, in the event that the individual chooses to return to the program and for archival purposes;
- b) Parental/family information will be retained *indefinitely* after an individual has left a program of SOFTBALL BC, in the event that the individual chooses to return to the program; *and for archival purposes*
- c) Information collected by coaches will be retained indefinitely after an individual has left a program of SOFTBALL BC, in the event that the individual chooses to return to the program and for archival purposes.
- d) Employee information will be retained for a period of seven years in accordance with Canada Customs and Revenue Agency requirements.
- e) Personal health information will be immediately destroyed when an individual chooses to leave a program of SOFTBALL BC.
- f) Marketing information, related specifically to individuals, will be immediately destroyed upon compilation and analysis of collected information; and
- g) As otherwise may be stipulated in federal or provincial legislation.

Personal information that is used to make a decision about an individual will be maintained for a minimum of one year of time to allow the individual access to the information after the decision has been made.

SOFTBALL BC may disclose personal information to a government authority that has asserted its lawful authority to obtain the information or where SOFTBALL BC has reasonable grounds to believe the information could be useful in the investigation of an unlawful activity, or to comply with a subpoena or warrant or an order made by the court or otherwise as permitted by applicable law.

Documents will be destroyed by way of shredding or secure destruction and electronic files will be deleted in their entirety. When hardware is discarded, SOFTBALL BC will ensure that the hard drive is physically destroyed.

Accuracy

SOFTBALL BC will strive to use accurate and up-to-date information as is necessary for the purposes for which it is to be used, to minimize the possibility that inappropriate information may be used to make a decision about an individual.

Safeguards

Personal information is protected by security safeguards appropriate to the sensitivity of the information against loss or theft, unauthorized access, disclosure, copying, use or modification.

Methods of protection and safeguards include, but are not limited to, locked filing cabinets, restricted access to offices, need-to-know access and technological measures including the use of passwords, encryption and firewalls.

The following steps will be taken to ensure security:

- a) Paper information is either under supervision or secured in a locked or restricted area.
- b) Electronic hardware is either under supervision or secured in a locked or restricted area at all times. In addition, passwords are used on computers.
- c) Paper information is transmitted through sealed, addressed envelopes or in boxes by reputable courier/delivery companies.
- d) Electronic information is transmitted either through a direct line or is encrypted.
- e) Staff is trained to collect, use and disclose personal information only as necessary to fulfill their duties and in accordance with this policy.
- f) External consultants and agencies with access to personal information will provide SOFTBALL BC with appropriate privacy assurances.

Openness

SOFTBALL BC will publicize information about its policies and practices relating to the management of personal information. This information is available through this policy, on SOFTBALL BC's web site or upon request by contacting the Privacy Officer. The name, business address, phone, fax and email address of the Privacy Officer will be available to the public.

Individual Access

Upon written request, an individual will be given access to information as is required under PIPA.

Requested information will be disclosed to the individual within 30 days of receipt of the written request at no cost to the individual, or at nominal cost relating to photocopying expenses, unless there are reasonable grounds to extend the time limit.

If personal information is inaccurate or incomplete, it will be amended as required.

An individual may be denied access to his or her personal information if:

- a) This information is prohibitively costly to provide;
- b) The information contains references to other individuals;
- c) The information cannot be disclosed for legal, security or commercial proprietary purposes;
- d) The information is subject to solicitor-client or litigation privilege
- e) Or any other reason as set out in the PIPA..

Upon refusal, SOFTBALL BC will inform the individual the reasons for the refusal and the associated provisions of PIPA.

Challenging Compliance

An individual may challenge SOFTBALL BC's compliance with this policy and PIPA, by submitting a challenge in writing to the President of SOFTBALL BC.

Upon receipt of a written complaint, SOFTBALL BC will:

- a) Record the date the complaint is received;
- b) Acknowledge receipt of the complaint by way of telephone conversation or email and clarify the nature of the complaint within fourteen days of receipt of the complaint;
- c) Appoint an investigator using SOFTBALL BC personnel or an independent investigator, who will have the skills necessary to conduct a fair and impartial investigation, and who will have

unfettered access to all files and personnel, within twenty-eight days of receipt of the complaint.

- d) Upon completion of the investigation and within 45 days of receipt of the complaint, the investigator will submit a written report to SOFTBALL BC.
- e) Notify the complainant of the outcome of the investigation and any relevant steps taken to rectify the complaint, including any proposed amendments to policies and procedures, within 60 days of receipt of the complaint.

An individual may appeal a decision made by SOFTBALL BC under this Policy, in accordance with SOFTBALL BC's policies for appeals as set out in the Handbook of Constitution and Bylaws.
